

TWO INFO MEETINGS FOR 12 MILE PROJECT ARE WEDNESDAY, MARCH 11

The Road Commission for Oakland County (RCOC) and the City of Berkley will host two public information meetings Wednesday, March 11, to share information about the project to repave 12 Mile Road from west of Greenfield Road to Coolidge Highway. The work will start in the spring of 2020.

MEETING DETAILS

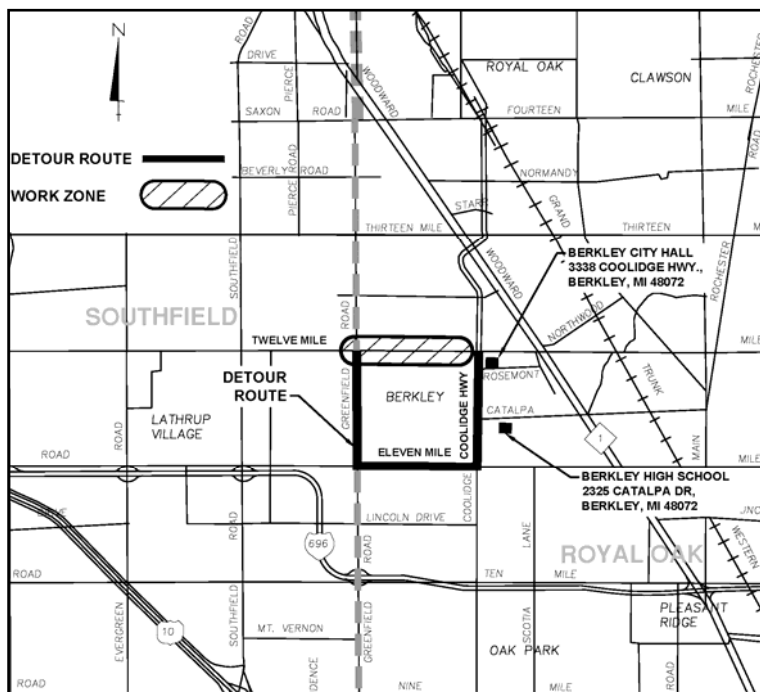
WHAT: Public information meetings to discuss the construction plans and the impact on traffic during construction.

NOTE: The meetings will be “open house” format. There will be no formal presentations. Anyone can attend any time between 9-11 a.m. or 4-7 p.m. to review information and speak with an RCOC or city representative.



PROJECT DETAILS

The project involves repaving this one-mile section of 12 Mile with three inches of new asphalt. The section between Greenfield Road and Ellwood Ave. will be completely reconstructed as will the side street approaches. Pedestrian crosswalks will be updated to Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards and crosswalk signals will be updated. Curbs and gutters will be repaired and there will be minor drainage improvements and new signs and pavement markings.

IMPACT ON TRAFFIC

The project will be constructed in two stages, beginning in June and being completed in the fall.

Stage 1: During this stage, the south half of this section of 12 Mile will be resurfaced, and traffic will be shifted to the north side. However, also during this stage, the section from Greenfield Road to Ellwood Drive will be completely reconstructed and will be closed to traffic for approximately a month. During the

closure, the detour route will be Greenfield to 11 Mile to Coolidge Hwy. and back to 12 Mile and vice versa.

Stage 2: The second stage will begin as soon as stage 1 is completed and will involve resurfacing the north half of the road, with traffic shifted to the south half. The road will remain open two-way traffic throughout stage 2.

FUNDING

The project is expected to cost approximately \$2.3 million. Federal funding is expected to cover 80 percent of the cost, with the remainder shared by RCOC and the City of Berkley.
