

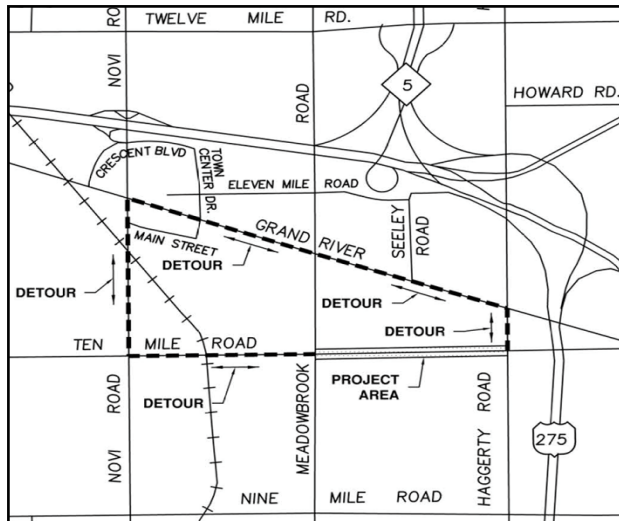
10 MILE ROAD TO BE RESURFACED AND IMPROVED IN 2022 AND 2023 BETWEEN MEADOWBROOK AND HAGGERTY ROADS

The Road Commission for Oakland County (RCOC) will rehabilitate, resurface and improve 10 Mile Road between Meadowbrook and Haggerty roads in Novi in 2022 and 2023.

PROJECT DETAILS

The project includes:

- Milling (grinding off) the existing road surface and repaving with asphalt
- Repairing the pavement at the Haggerty/10 Mile intersection
- Implementing safety improvements including a continuous center, left-turn lane; adding and extending selected right-turn and deceleration lanes; and widening the shoulders
- Repairing and replacing curbs and gutters
- Replacing two culverts under the road
- Upgrading pedestrian crosswalks to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)
- Upgrading the traffic signals at the 10 Mile/Meadowbrook and 10 Mile/Cranbrook intersections
- Adding eight-foot-wide sidewalk along the south side of this section of 10 Mile Road



- During the 2022 full closure, the **detour route for through traffic** will be Meadowbrook Road to Grand River Ave. to Haggerty Road and back to 10 Mile Road and vice versa.
- Work will resume in spring 2023, and the westbound lanes will close to through traffic. The eastbound lanes will remain open. All the road rehabilitation and repaving work will then take place.

- The 2023 detour for westbound traffic will be Haggerty Road to Grand River Ave. to Novi Road and back to 10 Mile Road.

- Work is expected to be completed and the road fully re-opened by fall 2023.
- During the road closures, access will be maintained to all homes and businesses within the project area.

PROJECT COST AND FUNDING

The project will cost approximately \$6.9 million. Approximately 60 percent of the cost will be paid for with federal road funding. The remainder will be shared by RCOC, Novi and Oakland County general government through the Tri-Party Program. The City of Novi will also complete some watermain and sidewalk work during the project.

SCHEDULE & IMPACT ON TRAFFIC

- Work will begin with tree removal in February or March of 2022. There will be intermittent lane closures. Utility companies will also relocate utilities during the spring.
- The road will then close to through traffic in the summer for the culvert replacements and watermain installation. The road will remain closed until November 2022 when work will stop for the year.
